Allegheny County Jail Welcomes New Director of Chaplaincy Services



The **Rev. Charissa Howe** will begin serving as the new Director of Chaplaincy Services at Allegheny County Jail and Shuman Center on June 23. Chaplaincy is a program of the Foundation of HOPE, Christian Associates' partner in ministry.

Rev. Howe is no stranger to HOPE: she has volunteered in HOPE's pre-release and aftercare programs, teaching the "Beyond Trauma and Abuse" class inside the jail since 2015. "I found that to be such a powerful experience," she said. "There's such a need for trauma care."

For the past four years, Rev. Howe has pastored St. Andrew's (Sewickley) & Emsworth Presbyterian Churches. In 2020,

she served as moderator of Pittsburgh Presbytery.

"I'm so excited to welcome Rev. Howe to the team," said Jody Raeford, Executive Director of the Foundation of HOPE. "She brings with her a compassionate servant leader attitude that seems to naturally recognize the humanity of all people."

Rev. Howe said she hopes the Chaplaincy Department can be a place of healing. "When you bring healing to one or two people, or to a pod of people—even a small amount of healing—that begins to help heal everything: all of this broken, hurting world," she said.

Repairing the Breach: Spiritual Leaders to Discuss Reparations

Confessing our sin inspires us to repent and seek to amend our lives. It also leads to a next step: reparation. How do we make whole those we have harmed? And what about those who have suffered systemic harm, across decades or even centuries, such as the descendants of those who were enslaved?

Clergy and other spiritual leaders from across our region will gather to discuss these important questions at *We Have to Talk* ... *About Reparations*, a dialogue event on **Tuesday**, **August** 24 from 1:00-2:30 p.m., via Zoom.

Our guests will help us think through reparations both locally and nationally, as a question of faith and as a practical reality.

The **Rev. Dr. Dale B. Snyder Sr.**, Senior Pastor of Bethel AME Church in Pittsburgh's Hill District, will speak on his congregation's quest for reparations after the demolition of their previous building during the redevelopment of the Lower Hill District in 1957.

Meanwhile, as seminaries, denominations, and religious orders consider the question of reparations, we'll welcome speakers from across the country to widen our perspectives. Find an up-to-date list of confirmed speakers at the event website.

As always, there will be opportunities for spiritual leaders to engage in small-group discussion: to meet one another, build relationship, and discover avenues for collaboration.



Overdose Awareness Day: A Time to Remember

Deaths by overdose accelerated during the COVID-19 pandemic. Each person lost to overdose is a person precious to God and created in God's image. Together, we can remember them in prayer and support those left behind.

Our region will observe *International Overdose Awareness Day* on **Friday, August 27** with a **noon** memorial at **Trinity Cathedra**l, 328 Sixth Avenue, Pittsburgh. The interfaith service includes prayers from faith leaders, testimonies from survivors, and blessings for first responders. Bells will toll for each overdose death in Allegheny County.

Along the sidewalk and throughout the cathedral grounds, passersby can discover a moving display of photos and memories remembering those who have died from overdose. Family members of overdose victims may submit photos to Karen Plavan to be included in the display: *karenplavan@gmail.com*.

Amen to Action Feeds Neighbors and Promotes Unity

One million meals for our neighbors: that's the goal of *Amen to Action*, an initiative that unites diverse Christians in meeting community need.

Partnering with Meals of Hope, *Amen to Action* will host meal-packing events at ten different sites on four different dates: Saturdays, November 6, 13, and 20, and Friday, November 26.

The hosts are varied in denominational affiliation and are located in many parts of Greater Pittsburgh, from Mt. Ararat Baptist Church to Crossroads United Methodist Church, from Orchard Hill Church to North Catholic High School.

Volunteers of all ages are welcome: *Amen to Action* is a great family volunteer activity.
